**The effects of the devastating earthquake
of April 2015 are still disrupting
daily life 3 years later**



The immediate aftermath was the death of nearly **9000** people, with over **20,000** injured and **millions** homeless. Centuries old buildings were destroyed. Cost estimates range from 50% to 100% of the countries GDP

Needless to say many of the buildings **destroyed** were **Schools**

Without counting the human cost of losing loved ones



3 years later people are still **living in tents**, their homes destroyed or so badly damaged they are **un-inhabitable**. Few had any insurance at all, and the those that did received very little in compensation.



Even today classes are being held in **temporary structures** with no insulation, exposed to the harsh elements, the winter cold, the torrential rain, the baking summers. Sometimes these structures are built next to the old classes rooms, a permanent reminder of better days. For children with very little, it is even harder to study and succeed, under a tent at school, and in a shack at home with no electric light under which to do homework.



How is Mayaa helping? Aside from our main role of **sponsoring the schooling** of individual children and running health camps, Mayaa is helping schools re-establish themselves. By funding the **rehabilitation** of class rooms into libraries and **study rooms**, pupils will have a space in which to study after classes. Our new **dedicated centre** will offer multi-function rooms that can be used for our regular adult conferences; but will also be used for after school **tutorial** groups and a space with table and chairs for pupils to do their **homework** and extra studies. This will be a major improvement from squatting on the floor by torch light. As the country slowly gets back on it's feet, every little bit helps the next generation in acquiring the education it needs to improve itself.
